The 1976 film *Network* chronicles the slide into insanity suffered by Howard Beale, a longtime TV news anchor. He learns he has two weeks left on the network before he has to leave due to declining ratings. Out of anger, Beale <u>rants to his audience</u> that the news is *bullshit*, asking them to see the futility of following the depressing events of the world every day and to *get mad*. Naturally, after Beale's breakdown on TV, his ratings soar. I won't spoil the rest, but it's worth your time. (If '70s films aren't your thing, Bryan Cranston's recent adaptation on Broadway is arguably better.) *Network* seems prescient to me now, when so much of our TV news is dominated by emotion and "that's the way it is" feels so far away.

Our access to information around the world has never been greater. The horrors half a world away are at our fingertips. Ought we pay any attention?
